Special Aspects

With food available in Ontario's north a large finch invasion was not predicted and this lowered both species and numbers. Birder participation had also dropped 23% from last year which may also affect results. New birds for the cumulative list were Wood Duck and Bufflehead. Rare birds for this time of year included Eastern Screech owl, Yellow bellied Sapsucker, Winter Wren and a Merlin on count week. The species with the highest number was Dark-eyed Junco (1289), more than double its average of 505 followed by European Starling (1107) and Canada Goose (833) which was slightly below its average.
